Children begin to look outside themselves.


Children imaginations are ignited.

The **education** of even a small child, therefore, does not aim at preparing him for school, but **for life.**



Materials and Lessons

While supporting their language and mathematical growth, we are responsible for providing students with a variety of cultural lessons and experiences.

Teachers are guides, not lectures. The instruction is individualize for each child. This ensures that each child is challenged.

Children have choices, there's no one-size-fits-all curriculum. Students are encouraged to be curious; they are engaged and love learning.

Materials and Lessons

- Children learn to solve problems and think, instead of repeat and memorize jargon.
- Children learn with and from each other in a mixed-age environment.
- Instead of competing with each other, they grow into a community, and practice all-important social skills every day.




